Emergency Medical Responder

The EMR Program is a competency based program offered in a blend of independent study and Instructor guided practical sessions, designed to provide the student with the basics of prehospital care.

The EMR Program prerequisite is the Standard First Aid and Level "C" CPR Certification, completed not more than 6 months prior to the start date of the EMR Program. EMR Certification is one of the prerequisites for the Emergency Medical Technician program.

The EMR program is offered in a delivery method that allows students to continue working full while studying to become an EMR. The EMR candidate will progress at his or her own pace in a self-study mode for the theory portion of the program. Practical skill sessions will be presented several times during the month, during the day, weekend or evenings. The program is designed as an entry-level program to work in the emergency services profession.

NAPD

National Academy of Professional Drivers

As an EMS professional, a vehicular accident on the way to an emergency creates delays in patient care and risk of injury to bystanders, your partners and yourself.

As a member of the emergency medical services community, you are acutely aware of injury and death in our society caused by automobile accidents. You alone see human suffering first hand.

Automobile accidents injure nearly two million people on our highways each year.



This course is designed to teach you special techniques in driving emergency vehicles.

Emergency Medical Technician

This program is competency based. Students assume a greater responsibility for their own learning. The student has to be well motivated and organized in meeting the objectives of the program in the designated time frame. Students are assessed by observing their performance in conditions similar to those in an occupational setting. Those items you learn and practice in the class days and from the modules are things that a good EMT-A must have a working knowledge and understanding of in order to provide the proper and effective patient care.

PREREQUISITES

Minimum age - 18 years old.
Emergency Medical Responder graduate.
Health Care Provider C.P.R. certification
Valid Class 4 Driver's License.
A high level of reading comprehension, and written and oral communication skills.



BTLS

Basic Trauma Life Support

Course focuses on trauma patients in the prehospital environment — how to identify, manage, and transport with the highest level of care for the greatest chance of survival.
